## **About Our New Officers and Representatives**

**Joseph Sargent** (President) is Assistant Professor of Musicology at the University of Alabama. His critical edition of music by English Renaissance composer Nathaniel Giles is forthcoming in the British Academy's Early English Church Music series. Other studies on various Renaissance and 20th-century repertories have appeared in *Early Music History, The Musical Times, Revista de Musicología, American Choral Review, Sacred Music,* and several essay collections. Prior to joining the Alabama faculty, he earned a Ph.D. from Stanford University and taught for six years at the University of Montevallo.

**Brett Boutwell** (Past President) is Associate Professor of Music at Louisiana State University. His work on American experimental music has appeared in the *Journal of the Society for American Music, Contemporary Music Review, American Music, Mitteilungen der Paul Sacher Stiftung*, and the *Grove Dictionary of American Music*. His recent article, "Keller's Zak, Duchamp's Mutt, and the Art of the Ruse," appears in the April 2019 issue of *Modernism/modernity*.

**Heidi Jensen** (Student Representative to AMS Council) is a PhD student in musicology at the University of Florida. Her current interests lie in reception theory, post-structural philosophies, and the aesthetics of criminality. She holds a dual master's degree in musicology and performance from the University of New Mexico, where she was supported by the Brothwell Guitar Endowment and awarded distinction for her thesis. She holds undergraduate degrees in anthropology (University of Rochester) and behavioral science. At UF Heidi has enjoyed revisiting her interdisciplinary interests through consecutive teaching posts in the university-wide course "What is the Good Life," and continues to perform as part of the UF Guitar Ensemble.
